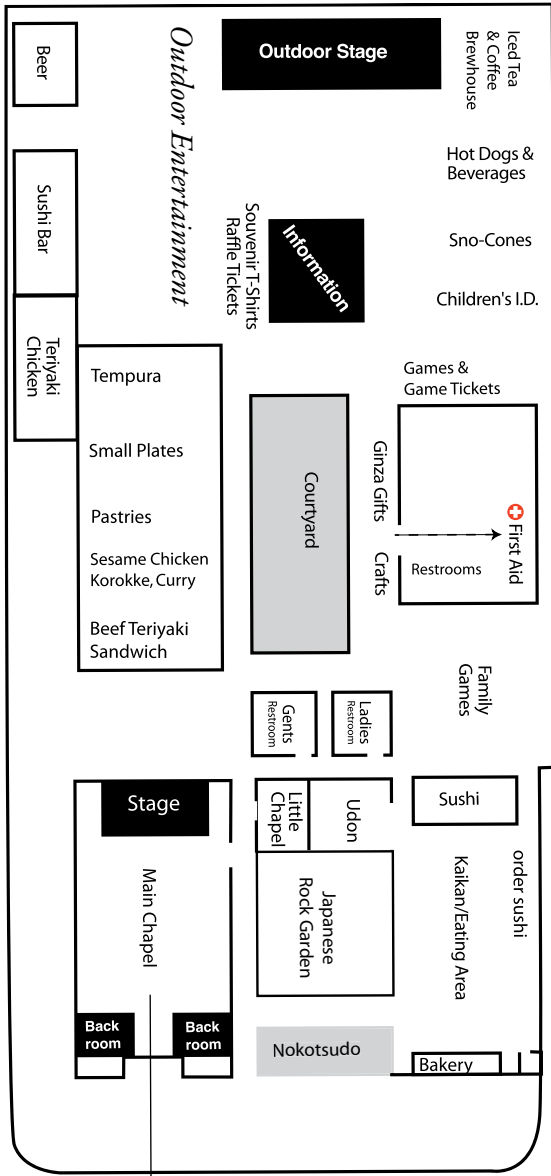


# Floor Plan of the Bazaar Food, Games, Gifts and Events

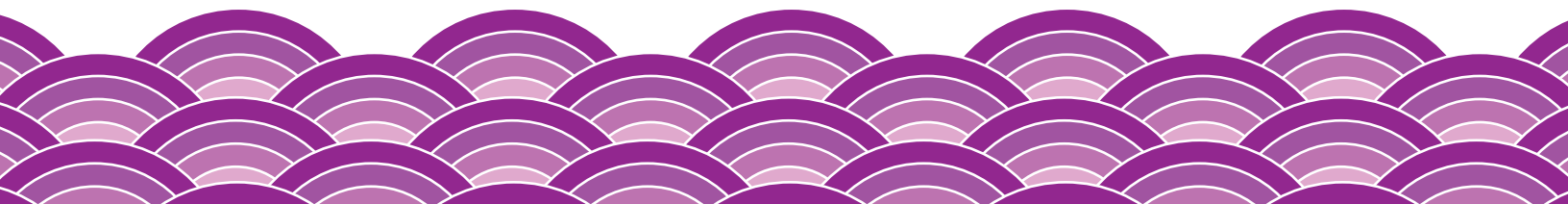
